Oklahoma Health Care Providers' Responsibilities and Rights Under Certain Medical Treatment Laws

Oklahoma law (Title 63, Sections 3160 & 3161 "Medical Treatment Laws Information Act") states that all healthcare providers who treat or consult on patients in an Oklahoma inpatient entity, either in person or via telemedicine, must complete this course once every two-calendar year period beginning in 2014.

Target Audience

Physicians, Allied Medical Professionals, Nurses, Administrators, Office Practice Managers or other parties who treat or advise on patients in an Oklahoma inpatient entity, either in person or via telemedicine.

Course Objectives

- the Oklahoma laws regarding disagreement with medical treatment directives
- the Oklahoma laws regarding withholding or withdrawing medical treatment
- what violates Oklahoma's law against assisting suicide

- the requirements concerning nutrition and hydration for patients in Oklahoma
