ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on March 14, 2002, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Defendant, Roger Timm, P.A., holding Oklahoma physician assistant license no PA1027, appeared in person and pro se.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
- 2. Defendant currently holds physician assistant license no. PA1027 under a five (5) year term of probation that commenced on or around January 25, 2001. Defendant's probation provides that at the end of one (1) year, the Board Secretary will review Defendant's probation reports to determine whether or not early termination or modification of probation may be warranted.
- 3. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Defendant has complied to date with the terms of probation and that the Board staff supports the early termination of probation.
- 4. Defendant has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 et seq. and 887.1 et seq.

2. Staff has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of the remainder of Defendant's probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Defendant's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Defendant serve the remainder of his probationary term.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1. Staff's application to terminate probation is **GRANTED** and Defendant's probationary period is terminated effective March 14, 2002.
