ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT UNDER TERMS OF PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Examiners en banc on September 27, 1985, at 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff and the Defendant appeared in person and by counsel, David Kline.

The Board of Medical Examiners en banc heard the testimony and reviewed the exhibits and being fully advised in the premises the Board of Medical Examiners therefore finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Defendant's case originally came on for hearing before the Board on September 21, 1984.

2. At that appearance, the Defendant voluntarily surrendered his Oklahoma Medical License No. 10934 in lieu of a hearing on the Complaint filed herein and said voluntary surrender was accepted by the Board en banc.

3. That the Board specifically retained continuing jurisdiction over the Defendant and ruled that the Defendant may re-apply for the aforesaid Oklahoma Medical License when his personal circumstances change and at the time of the Defendant's re-application the Board may inquire into the Defendant's professional and clinical competence.

4. That the Defendant was incarcerated in a federal penal institution in Fort Worth, Texas, for a period of eight and one-half months and then spent one and one-half months in a halfway house in Oklahoma City undergoing private therapy with Fred Webber. That the Defendant is presently living with his parents and interviewing for a position with the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health.

5. That Defendant will remain on parole on his federal conviction until November, 1986, and that terms of his federal parole include the Defendant's continued successful participation in drug-aftercare and submitted weekly urine samples for testing. That the Defendant appeared fully in control of his faculties and the Defendant through reading and study had maintained his professional and clinical competence and there was no evidence of any present impairment of the Defendant's professional and clinical competence to practice medicine.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Defendant presently meets all requirements to practice medicine in Oklahoma and has adequate professional and clinical competence therein.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of Oklahoma as follows:

1. That Defendant's Oklahoma Medical License No. 10934 should be and the same is hereby reinstated, upon the Defendant paying appropriate renewal costs, under the terms and conditions set forth below.


2. That Defendant, William Patrick Mappes, M.D., License No. 10934, be and is hereby placed on probation of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Examiners for a period of five years beginning October 1, 1985, under the following terms and conditions:

- a. During the period of probation Defendant will not prescribe, administer or dispense any medications for his personal use, to include controlled dangerous substances.
- b. During the period of probation Defendant will take no medication except that which is authorized by a physician treating him for a legitimate medical need and Defendant shall have an affirmative duty to inform any physician treating him of Defendant's previous use of cocaine.
- c. During the period of probation Defendant will abstain from consuming alcohol or any substances which would adversely affect his ability to practice medicine or surgery as interpreted by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Examiners.
- d. During the period of probation Defendant will submit biological fluid specimens to include, but not limited to, blood and urine, for analysis, upon request of any inspector or other agent representing the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Examiners and Defendant will pay for necessary testing and analysis of those specimens.
- e. During the period of probation Defendant will continue under psychiatric care and authorize said physician to report to the Board periodically on Defendant's progress and to continue all supportive programs recommended thereby.
- f. During the period of probation Defendant will furnish to the office of the State Board of Medical Examiners all current legal addresses and any change of address in writing.
- g. That Defendant shall appear before the Board or a designated member thereof whenever requested to do so.
