ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc on the 4th day of February, 1989, at the Holiday Inn, 3535 NW 39th Expressway, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Jone Kendrick, M.D., Defendant, appeared in person, pro se, and announced she was ready to proceed without the assistance of counsel.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc heard testimony and reviewed exhibits relating to the Defendant's request for termination of probation and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision therefore finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Defendant, Jone Kendrick, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 10986.
2. That the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That following notice and hearing held on September 11, 1987, Defendant was placed on a period of probation of three (3) years beginning on September 11, 1987, under certain enumerated terms and conditions.
4. That since the imposition of that original Final Order, Defendant has been in compliance with terms and conditions of the probation imposed and there is no reason why the Defendant should continue under the probation terms.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Board retains continuing jurisdiction over the length of probation and the terms and conditions thereof and can modify probation previously imposed either on the motion of the Defendant or upon its own motion.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. That the probation originally imposed on the Defendant, Jone Kendrick, M.D., Oklahoma Medical License No. 10986, should be and the same is hereby TERMINATED and held for naught.

2. That this Order Terminating Probation should be entered on the public record maintained by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision relating to this Defendant.
