2ND ORDER MODIFYING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on May 5, 2005, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Ambrosio A. Solano, M.D., holding probated Oklahoma medical license no. 11827, appeared in person without counsel, thereby waiving his right to legal representation.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
- 2. Dr. Solano currently holds Oklahoma medical license no. 11 827 under a five (5) year term of probation which began May 29, 2003.
- 3. On January 27, 2005, Dr. Solano requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to utilize Shelley Lee Wills, an unlicensed health care provider, to act as his chaperone when he is examining or performing services on female patients. Dr. Solano also requested that the requirement that he be required to comply with the Impaired Physician Contract with Hillcrest Medical Center be deleted since he is no longer employed by Hillcrest Medical Center. Dr. Solano's request was granted by the Board.

- 4. On May 5, 2005, Dr. Solano requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to continue his treatment with his therapist and his psychiatrist every other week, rather than every week as is currently required under his May 29, 2003 Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction.
 - 5. Dr. Solano presented sufficient evidence to support the requested modifications.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 et seq.
- 2. Dr. Solano has presented satisfactory evidence to justify allowing him to continue his treatment with his therapist and his psychiatrist every other week, rather than every week as is currently required under his May 29, 2003 Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1 Dr. Solano's application to modify the terms of his probation is **GRANTED**.
- 2. Dr. Solano's probation shall continue from May 29, 2003 for a period of five (5) years under the terms and conditions set forth in the May 29, 2003 Order and the January 27, 2005 Order Modifying Probation, with the exception that Dr. Solano be allowed to continue his treatment with his therapist and his psychiatrist every other week, rather than every week as is currently required under his May 29, 2003 Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction.
- 3. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke Dr. Solano's medical license, after additional notice and hearing as required by law.
- 4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Solano as soon as it is processed.
