ORDER

NOW on this 23rd day of January, 1981 comes on for final determination the above styled and captioned cause before the State Board of Medical Examiners, the hearing of said matter being continued from September 1980. Upon consideration of all testimony and evidence adduced at the initial hearing and consideration of the supplemental evidenced introduced on this day, the Board of Medical Examiners made the following Order:

That Robert Hughes Millwee III, M.D., is guilty of unprofessional conduct in that he is in violation of the Medical Practice Act, paragraphs 5 and 16 Section 509, Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

That Dr. Millwee is in violation of Rules 1, 3, 5, and 6 of the Rules and Regulations of the State Medical Board.

That Dr. Millwee was an impaired physician from 1978 to the date of the complaint due to his habitual use of alcohol.

That Dr. Millwee habitually used habit-forming drugs

That Dr. Millwee obtained said drugs for his own personal use.

That Dr. Millwee prescribed drugs to patients without ascertaining any medical need for said drugs.

That based upon the findings by the Doard, Dr. Millwee should be placed on a three year probationary term with the following conditions and terms

That Dr. Millwee is to keep duplicate, serially numbered prescriptions for all Scheduled drugs which he prescribes, administers or dispenses;

- 2. That the Board recommends that Dr. Millwee continue with the AA program; That Dr. Millwee refrain from self-medicating or obtaining any drug for his personal use unless so ordered by his attending physician
- 4. That Dr. Millwee submit blood and urine specimens when requested to lo so by an Inspector from the Medical Board;
 - 5. That Dr. Millwee abstain totally from the use of alcohol;

7. That failure to abide by these terms and conditions of probation wi result in a citation being issued.

COMPLAINT

COMES NOW Carole A. Smith, Inspector for the State Board of Medical Examiners, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, being first duly sworn upon oath, and states as follows:

- 1. That Robert Hughes Millwee III., M.D., holding Oklahoma Medical license #12140, is charged with unprofessional conduct, to-wit: Violation of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59
 O.S. Supp. 1979, Section 509, Paragraphs 5 and 16, to-wit:
 - "5. Habitual intemperance or the habitual use of habit-forming drugs."
 - "16. The inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of ... drunkeness, excessive use of drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or any other type of material ...:"
- 2. That Robert Hughes Millwee III., M.D., has violated the Rules and Regulations of the State Board of Medical Examiners, to-wit: Rule 1, Rule 3, Rule 5, and Rule 6. Said rules appear in the Rules and Regulations of the State Board of Medical Examiners, "IX Revocation of License or Certificates Physicians and Surgeons," page 10 of the revised rules. Said rules are as follows:

- "Rule 1.- Indiscriminate or excessive prescribing, dispensing, or administering of Controlled or Narcotic drugs."
- "Rule 3.- The habitual or excessive use of any drug which impairs the ability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to the patient."
- "Rule 5.- Purchasing or prescribing any regulated substance in Schedules I through V., as defined by the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, for the physicians personal use.
- "Rule 6.- Dispensing, prescribing or administering a Controlled Substance or Narcotic Drug without medical need."
- 3. That from 1973 to date, Robert Hughes Millwee, III M.D., has been impaired by the habitual use of alcohol.
- 4. That Dr. Millwee is guilty of habitual use of thorazine, dalmane, noludar and placidyl.
- 5. That Dr. Millwee has obtained said drugs for his own personal use in violation of the rules and regulations of this Board.
- 6. That for a period of time from August through December of 1979 Dr. Millwee prescribed Scheduled Drugs to patients Erin Tucker and Mike Bradshaw without establishing need for said drugs.
- 7. That the complainant verily believes that the abuse of alcohol and drugs for a period of time in excess of seven (7) years has rendered Dr. Millwee unable to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to his patients.
- 8. That Robert Hughes Millwee III., M.D., is the holder of an unrevoked license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Oklahoma

WHEREFORE, premises considered, Complainant prays that upon proof of the facts herein alleged, the Board take such disciplinary action as in authorized by law
