ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc on the 11th day of September, 1987, at 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff, and Douglas G. Cox, M.D., Defendant, appeared in person without counsel and agreed to proceed, waiving his right to representation by legal counsel.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc heard the testimony and reviewed exhibits and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Douglas G. Cox, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 12259.
2. That the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That the Defendant was heretofore placed on probation to the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and that since that time the Defendant has been in compliance with all the terms and conditions of the aforesaid probation.
4. That the purpose of the probation imposed by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has been fulfilled and there does not exist any reason to continue this Defendant under probation to the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has continuing jurisdiction over this Defendant based on the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59 O.S. 1981, §507, and the prior individual proceeding which resulted in the original probation.


ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:


1. That the probation heretofore imposed on Douglas G. Cox, M.D., Oklahoma Medical License No. 12259, should be and the same is hereby terminated, cancelled, and held for naught.

2. That the staff of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision should notify the Defendant of this decision as soon as possible and should note in the official record that the probation heretofore imposed on this Defendant has been lawfully terminated.
