# ORDER VACATING REVOCATION OF LICENSE AND REINSTATING SAME

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc on the 9th day of June, 1989, at the Doubletree Inn at Warren Place, 6100 South Yale, Tulsa, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Michael D. Brooks, M.D., appeared in person and with counsel, Mack Martin and Merle Gile, for the Defendant.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc heard testimony and reviewed exhibits and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision therefore finds as follows:

## FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. That Defendant, Michael D. Brooks, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 13685.
- 2. That the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
- 3. That on or around September 11, 1987, following notice and hearing, the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision revoked Defendant's Medical License No. 13685 based on uncontroverted evidence of the Defendant's activities at the OB/GYN Department of the United States Naval Hospital, Charleston, South Carolina.
- 4. Evidence from the Defendant was presented relating to his activities at the OB/GYN Department of the United States Naval Hospital, Charleston, South Carolina, and the Defendant also advised that he was employed as a full-time member of the medical staff of the Department of Obstetrics/Gynecology of the Metro Medical Group, 1800 Tuxedo, Detroit, Michigan 48208, and has served in that capacity since January 7, 1987, and has remained a member of that department in good standing. Defendant further testified he has maintained staff memberships and privileges at both Hutzel Hospital in the Detroit Medical Center and Henry Ford Hospital.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

 That in light of sworn testimony received from the Defendant, the allegations concerning the Defendant's activities at the OB/GYN Department of the United States Naval Hospital, Charleston, South Carolina, do not constitute unprofessional conduct as defined by 59 O.S. 1981, Sec. 509, and that no sanctions should be imposed, and the Defendant's license should be restored.

#### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- That the Defendant, Michael D. Brooks, M.D., should be restored to Oklahoma Medical License No. 13685 and the Board's prior Final Order revoking same should be vacated, set aside and held for naught.
- That a copy of this Order should be placed in the Defendant's public licensure file at the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and made a part of the public record.
- That staff members of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision should forward a copy of this Order to the Defendant by and through his counsel as soon as possible.
