ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Medical Board of Licensure and Supervision (the "Board") on March 12, 2015, at the office of the Board, 101 N.E. 51st Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board. Defendant, Joel Brent McCurdy, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 13910, appeared in person. Dr. Westcott appeared in support of Defendant. Gary Ricks, Compliance Coordinator, appeared on behalf of the State.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the Motion and being fully apprised of the premises entered the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Orders:

Findings of Fact

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and rules of the Board.
- 2. On June 23, 2006, after a hearing before the Board *en banc*, the Board accepted a Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction (VSJ). Defendant agreed to abide by the terms and conditions of the VSJ for a period of ONE (1) YEAR, commencing on June 23, 2006 and terminating on June 23, 2007.
- On March 27, 2009, Defendant Joel Brent McCurdy appeared before the Board pro se, requesting reinstatement of his license. After a hearing before the Board en banc, the Board GRANTED the request and issued an Order Granting Reinstatement of License Under Terms of Indefinite Probation, commencing on March 27, 2009, to continue indefinitely.

4. Defendant is seeking to terminate the indefinite probation that commenced on March 27, 2009. After hearing testimony, the Board has determined that it is appropriate to terminate the Defendant's indefinite probation at this time.

Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 O.S. §480 *et seq*. The Board may also modify, or remove entirely, previously placed restrictions.
- 2. Dr. McCurdy presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of his indefinite probation.

Order

It is therefore **ORDERED** by the Oklahoma State Medical Board of Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1. Defendant's indefinite probation, the terms of which are described in the Order Granting Reinstatement of License Under Terms of Indefinite Probation, commencing on March 27, 2009 is hereby **TERMINATED**.
- 2. Promptly upon receipt of an invoice, Defendant shall pay all costs of this action authorized by law.
- 3. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. McCurdy as soon as it is processed.
