INTERIM ORDER

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Examiners en banc on January 31, 1986, at 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the Rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff, and T Michael Jackson, Attorney, appeared for the Defendant.

The counsel for the parties then advised the Board of Medical Examiners of a proposed disposition of this case. Said proposal is hereby adopted and the Board of Medical Examiners being fully advised in the premises therefor finds and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That James Ray Welch, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 13985
2. That the Board of Medical Examiners en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the Rules of the Board.
3. That the facts set forth in the Complaint served on the Defendant are true and correct.
4. That the Defendant, under the advice of competent counsel, and in lieu of a full hearing on the issues set forth in the Complaint, does hereby consent that this medical license be suspended during the time of his incarceration.
5. That when the Defendant is released from incarceration or at such time as the Defendant's release is imminent, the Defendant may immediately reapply for his Oklahoma medical license and that the Board specifically retains continuing jurisdiction to review the applicant at that time as to his professional and clinical competence and as to the complete circumstances of his return to actual medical practice.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

1. That under the legal mandate of 59 O.S. 1981, Section 513, the Board is required to revoke or suspend this Defendant's medical license.

ORDER


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Examiners of Oklahoma as follows:


1. That the Defendant's Oklahoma Medical License No. 13985 be and the same is hereby suspended during the time of his incarceration.
2. That the Board specifically retains continuing jurisdiction over the Defendant and when the Defendant is released from incarceration or when the Defendant's release is imminent, the Defendant may immediately reapply for the aforesaid Oklahoma medical license. At the next available meeting after the time of the Defendant's reapplication the Board may hold a hearing and make any reasonable inquiry into the Defendant's professional and clinical competence and into the facts and setting of the Defendant's proposed return to medical practice.
