### ORDER DENYING TERMINATION OF PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on July 22, 2010, at the Board's office, 101 N.E. 51<sup>st</sup> Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

David Earl Linden, M.D., appeared in person and through counsel, Andrew T. Harrison.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the exhibits presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

# Findings of Fact

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
  - 2. Dr. Linden currently holds medical license no. 14324.
- 3. On July 22, 2010, Dr. Linden requested that his probation be terminated so that he could attempt to rebuild his practice and professional reputation while not under probation.
  - 4. The evidence reflects the following:
    - a. On November 3, 2006, Dr. Linden's license was suspended by the Board for forty-five (45) days, to be followed by a three (3) year term of probation.
    - b. On January 19, 2007, Dr. Linden's three (3) year term of probation began.

- c. On September 25, 2008, the State filed a new Complaint against Dr. Linden based upon violation of his probation.
- d. On November 6, 2008, the Board entered a Final Order of Probation and Administrative Fine whereby it ordered a new three (3) hear term of probation to run January 19, 2010 through January 19, 2013.
- f. At the time of his request for termination of probation, Dr. Linden had served only six (6) months of his second three (3) year term of probation.
- 5. The proposed early termination of Dr. Linden's probation does not afford sufficient practice limitations or controls to assure that Dr. Linden can practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear requests for termination of probations under 59 Okla. Stat. \$480 et seq.
- 2. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 Okla. Stat. §480 et seq.

### **ORDER**

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1. Dr. Linden's request for termination of his probation is **DENIED**.
- 2. A copy of this written order shall be sent to Dr. Linden as soon as it is processed.
