ORDER MODIFYING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on September 28, 2000, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Lynn Dean Baggett, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 14448, appeared in person without counsel, thereby waiving his right to legal representation.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
2. Dr. Baggett currently holds medical license no. 14448 under an indefinite term of probation that commenced September 24, 1998.
3. On September 2, 1999, Dr. Baggett requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him an interdepartmental transfer to Carl Albert Hospital in McAlester, Oklahoma, which request was granted by the Board on September 16, 1999.
4. On September 15, 2000, Dr. Baggett requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to prescribe Schedule IV and V controlled dangerous drugs at his restricted location to be filled only by the pharmacy within that facility.

5. Dr. Baggett presented sufficient evidence to support the requested modification.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*
2. Dr. Baggett has presented satisfactory evidence to justify allowing him to prescribe Schedule IV and V controlled dangerous drugs at his restricted location to be filled only by the pharmacy within that facility.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. Baggett's application to modify the terms of his probation is **GRANTED**.
2. Dr. Baggett's probation shall continue indefinitely from the date of its commencement of September 24, 1998 under the terms and conditions set forth in the September 24, 1998 Order and the September 16, 1999 modification, with the exception that Dr. Baggett be allowed to prescribe Schedule IV and V controlled dangerous drugs at his restricted location to be filled only by the pharmacy within that facility.
3. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke Dr. Baggett's medical license, after additional notice and hearing as required by law.
4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Baggett as soon as it is processed.
