ORDER DENYING REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on September 21, 2006, at the Board office, 5104 North Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73118, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Lynn Dean Baggett, M.D., Applicant, appeared in person and pro se.

Elizabeth A. Scott, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the exhibits presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, entered the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Applicant previously held Oklahoma Medical License No. 14448.

2. On November 20, 2003, the Board revoked Applicant's license for unprofessional conduct in violation of 59 O.S. §509 (5), (9), (14) and (16), and OAC 435:10-7-4(3), (11), (17), (39) and (40).

3. Applicant's license had previously been suspended in 1989, 1990, 1992 and 2003, and had been revoked in 1994, 1997 and 2003. When Applicant's license was reinstated after the second revocation in 1997, the Board stated that if Applicant was ever revoked again, he could never apply for reinstatement. Applicant was subsequently revoked again in 2003.

4. Applicant has applied for reinstatement of his license.

5. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

6. Applicant has failed to show that he meets all requirements for licensure, including but not limited to, the requirement that he produce satisfactory evidence that he has the ability to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein pursuant to 59 O.S. §480 et seq.

2. The Applicant has failed to sustain his burden of proof that he has met all requirements for reinstatement of his medical license, including, but not limited to, the requirement that he produce satisfactory evidence that he has the ability to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Applicant's request for reinstatement of his medical license shall be **DENIED.**
