ORDER DENYING
DEFENDANT'S MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on February 2, 1990, at the office of the Oklahoma State Medical Association, 601 N.W. Expressway, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Eric Kranz, M.D., Defendant, appeared in person, and by counsel, William Jack.

The Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc heard testimony, reviewed exhibits tendered, and being fully advised in the premises the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision therefore finds and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Defendant, Eric Kranz, M.D., formerly held Oklahoma Medical License No. 14602.
2. That the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That following notice and hearing on or around February 3, 1989, the Defendant's Medical License No. 14602 was revoked.
4. That the Defendant filed a Motion for Reconsideration.
5. That the denial of Defendant's application for licensure by the Ohio State Medical Board on or around June 19, 1987, was still a matter of record and had not been set aside, modified or reversed.
6. That the revocation of the Defendant's license to practice medicine by the West Virginia Board of Medicine that occurred on or around March 18, 1988, was still a matter of record and had not been set aside, modified or reversed. The Defendant did lodge a formal appeal of the action taken by the West Virginia Board of Medicine but no appellate decision had been rendered by the court.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Defendant failed to present adequate evidence on which the Board could base a decision to grant the relief requested by the Defendant of reconsideration.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. That the Motion for Reconsideration of the Defendant, Eric Kranz, M.D., formerly holding Oklahoma Medical License No. 14602, should be and the same is hereby DENIED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc.

2. That the staff should prepare a formal written order of this decision and file it of record.
