ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on November 2, 2000, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Mark Lynn, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 14916, appeared in person and *pro se*.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
- 2. Dr. Lynn currently holds medical license no. 14916 under a five (5) year term of probation that commenced on or around July 27, 1996.
- 3. Dr. Lynn previously requested and was granted by Order dated March 12, 1999 a modification of his probation to allow him to order or prescribe controlled substances in Schedules III, IV and V, and to order dispense or administer life-saving drugs to a patient in an emergency, life-threatening situation.
- 4. Dr. Lynn has requested that his probation be terminated so as to allow him to sit for the board certification examination in family medicine.

- 5. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Dr. Lynn had complied to date with the terms of probation and that the Board staff did not object to the requested termination.
- 6. Dr. Lynn has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. Dr. Lynn has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested early termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 et seq.
- 2. Dr. Lynn has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of the remainder of his probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Dr. Lynn's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Dr. Lynn serve the remainder of his probationary term.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1. Dr. Lynn's application to terminate probation is GRANTED and his probationary period is terminated effective November 2, 2000.
