ORDER MODIFYING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on January, 2007, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Bruce Stewart Gilmore, M.D., holding probated Oklahoma medical license no. 15474, appeared in person without counsel, thereby waiving his right to legal representation.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

2. Dr. Gilmore currently holds Oklahoma medical license no. 15474 under an indefinite term of probation which began September 23, 2004.

3. On July 21, 2005, Dr. Gilmore requested that the terms of his probation be modified whereby he would be required to abide by the current terms and recommendations of Rush rather than the recommendations made at the time of his discharge in 2004. The Board granted the requested modification.

4. On January 18, 2007, Dr. Gilmore requested that the terms of his probation be modified whereby he would not be restricted to a forty (40) hour work week, and he would only

be required to attend three (3) 12-Step meetings per week, two (2) of which per month would be with the Health Professionals Recovery Program.

5. Dr. Gilmore presented sufficient evidence to support the requested modifications.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 et seq.

2. Dr. Gilmore has presented satisfactory evidence to justify modifying the terms of his probation whereby he would not be restricted to a forty (40) hour workweek, and he would only be required to attend three (3) 12-Step meetings per week, two (2) of which per month would be with the Health Professionals Recovery Program.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. Gilmore's application to modify the terms of his probation is **GRANTED**.

2. Dr. Gilmore's probation shall continue from September 23, 2004 for an indefinite term under the terms and conditions set forth in the September 23, 2004 Order and the July 21, 2005 Order Modifying Probation, with the exception that Dr. Gilmore is not restricted to a forty (40) hour work week, and he is only required to attend three (3) 12-Step meetings per week, two (2) of which per month will be with the Health Professionals Recovery Program.

3. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke Dr. Gilmore's medical license, after additional notice and hearing as required by law.

4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Gilmore as soon as it is processed.
