## <u>ORDER</u>

NOW ON this 9th day of September, 1994, there came on before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision the motion of the Defendant, Jefferson Davis Erwin, M.D., to modify the limitations of the special license previously granted to the Defendant to allow the Defendant to work at certain enumerated prison facilities in this State other that at McAlester. And the Board, having heard witness and argument in this matter and otherwise being fully apprised of the facts and law herein, finds as follows:

## FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. It is within the Board's discretion to grant or deny a motion to modify the limitations of a special license granted by the Board.
- 2. Based upon the evidence presented by the Defendant, the Board finds that the Defendant's motion to modify the limitation of his special license should be denied.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has jurisdiction in this matter by virtue of the provisions of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59 O.S.1991, §§ 481 et seq., as amended.
- 2. By virtue of the provisions of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, the Board has the power and jurisdiction to enforce the provisions of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act as the Board deems necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

### ORDER

It is therefore ORDERED that the Defendant's motion is DENIED.
