SECOND ORDER MODIFYING PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (referred to herein as the “Board” or “State”) on July 23, 2015, at the office of the Board, 101 N.E. 51st Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Kent Thomas King, M.D. (“Defendant”), holding Oklahoma medical license no. 16153, appeared in person. Dr. Robert Westcott, Medical Director at the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program, Inc. (OHPP), appeared in support of Defendant.

Gary Ricks, Compliance Coordinator, appeared on behalf of the State.

The Board *en banc* after hearing arguments of counsel, reviewing the request and being fully advised in the premises, and for good cause shown, finds and orders as follows:

Findings of Fact

1. Defendant currently holds medical license no. 16153.
2. Defendant is currently under terms of an Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction, which commenced on March 8, 2012.
3. On March 12, 2015, Defendant requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to increase his work hours to a maximum of 60 hours per week, which was GRANTED.
4. On March 17, 2015 an Order Modifying Probation was filed, modifying Defendant’s work hours to a maximum of 60 hours per week.

5. On July 17, 2015, Defendant requested that the terms of his probation be modified as follows:

- a. Remove the word "licensed" from Paragraph P; and
- b. Modify the chaperone requirement to apply only to female patients.

Conclusions of Law

1. The Board is a duly authorized agency of the State of Oklahoma empowered to license and oversee the activities of physicians and surgeons in the State of Oklahoma pursuant to Title 59 Okla. Stat. § 480 *et seq.* Notice was given in all respects in accordance with law and the rules of the Board.

2. The Board therefore has jurisdiction and authority over the Defendant and subject matter herein pursuant to the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act (the "Act") and its applicable regulations. The Board is authorized to enforce the Act as necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare. Tit. 59 O.S. § 480 *et seq.*

3. Defendant presented sufficient evidence and good cause to support the requested modifications of probation including: (1) modification to Paragraph P, removing the word "licensed," and, (2) modifying the chaperone requirement to apply only to female patients.

Orders

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:


1. Defendant's application for modifications to the terms of his probation are **GRANTED**, removing the word "licensed" from Paragraph P, and modifying the chaperone requirement to apply only to female patients.

2. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke the Oklahoma medical license of Dr. Kent Thomas King, M.D., after additional notice and hearing as required by law.

3. Promptly upon receipt of an invoice, Defendant shall pay all costs of this action authorized by law.

4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Defendant as soon as it is processed.
