ORDER TERMINATING INDEFINITE PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (“Board”) on July 20, 2017, at the office of the Board, 101 N.E. 51st Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73105, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Gary Ricks, Compliance Coordinator, appeared for the Plaintiff. David G. Blackshaw, M.D. (“Defendant”) appeared in person, pro se. Dr. Robert Westcott, Director of the Oklahoma Health Professionals Program, Inc. (“OHPP”), appeared and testified.

The Board considered testimony, reviewed the evidence and being fully apprised of the premises makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Orders:

Findings of Fact

1. David G. Blackshaw, M.D. holds Oklahoma medical license no. 16528, which was issued on July 1, 1988.
2. On March 16, 2012, a Complaint and Citation were filed; hearing was set for May 17, 2012.
3. On May 17, 2012, an Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction was filed, with certain terms and conditions, including **INDEFINITE PROBATION**.
4. An Order Modifying Probation was filed November 10, 2014, deleting term “Y.”
5. On July 5, 2017, Board staff issued a Memorandum, Staff Motion to Terminate Indefinite Probation (“Motion to Terminate”); hearing was set for July 20, 2017.

6. At the July 20, 2017 meeting of the Board, Mr. Ricks presented staff's Motion to Terminate. Dr. Westcott testified regarding Defendant's performance at OHPP. Defendant testified on his own behalf.

Conclusions of Law

7. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 O.S. §480 *et seq.* The Board may also modify, or remove entirely, previously placed restrictions.
8. Defendant presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of his indefinite probation.

Order

1. **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:
2. The **INDEFINITE PROBATION of DAVID G. BLACKSHAW, M.D.**, the terms of which are set in the Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction, filed May 17, 2012, is hereby **TERMINATED**, effective July 20, 2017.
3. Promptly upon receipt of an invoice, Defendant shall pay all costs of this action authorized by law, including without limitation, legal fees, investigation costs, staff time, salary and travel expenses, witness fees and attorney's fees.
4. A copy of this order shall be provided to Defendant as soon as it is processed.
