ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on June 25, 1993, at the office of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Norman Darryl Houchen, M.D., Defendant, appeared pro se, waived his right to legal counsel, and agreed to proceed without counsel.

The Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision heard argument and statements, reviewed exhibits and being fully advised in the premises, the Oklahoma Board finds and orders as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Defendant, Norman Darryl Houchen, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 16779.
2. That the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That on or around January 12, 1989, Defendant did voluntarily sign a Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction and said Voluntary Submittal was accepted by the Board in lieu of a formal evidentiary hearing, and the Defendant did submit to a five-year probation to the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.
4. That the Defendant is in compliance with the terms and conditions of probation and has not been cited for any violations thereof.
5. That the Defendant's conduct and near completion of his entire term of probation merits consideration by the Board to terminate Defendant's probation.
6. That the Defendant has secured a position in solo practice in or around Marshall, Texas, and has been advised it would be easier for him to obtain licensure in Texas as a physician and surgeon if he was not on probation in the State of Oklahoma. That the Defendant's probation is scheduled to terminate by operation of law in October, 1993.

7. That the Board should terminate Defendant's probation instanter and show that action as a matter of record.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has lawful jurisdiction over this Defendant pursuant to the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59 O.S. 1991, Sec. 481 et seq.

2. That the Board within its discretion may terminate the probation of a Defendant for good cause shown.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. That the probation of Defendant, Norman Darryl Houchen, M.D., holding Oklahoma Medical License No. 16779, to the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision should be TERMINATED instanter.

2. That a copy of this written Order should be sent to the Defendant and/or his legal counsel as soon as possible so their record is complete.
