ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on July 27, 2000, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Stephen Travis Peake, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 17254, appeared in person and with his legal counsel, Lana Tyree.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
2. Dr. Peake currently holds medical license no. 17254 under a five (5) year term of probation that commenced on or around January 20, 1996.
3. Dr. Peake previously requested and was granted by Order dated March 13, 1997 a modification of his probation to allow him to prescribe controlled substances to outpatients.
4. Dr. Peake has requested that his probation be terminated effective September 1, 2000 so as to allow him to act as the alternative supervisor for physician assistants at his place of employment.
5. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Dr. Peake had complied to date with the terms of probation and that the Board staff did not object to the requested termination.

6. Dr. Peake has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. Dr. Peake has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested early termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1 The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*

2. Dr. Peake has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of the remainder of his probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Dr. Peake's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Dr. Peake serve the remainder of his probationary term.


ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. Peake's application to terminate probation is **GRANTED** and his probationary period is terminated effective September 1, 2000.

2. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Peake as soon as it is processed.
