

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*
2. Dr. Van Doren has presented satisfactory evidence to justify allowing him to write outpatient prescriptions for Schedules II through V controlled dangerous substances on serially numbered duplicate prescriptions.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. Van Doren's application to modify the terms of his probation is **GRANTED**.
2. Dr. Van Doren's probation shall continue indefinitely from the date of its commencement of January 30, 2000 under the terms and conditions set forth in the March 9, 2000 Order, with the exception that Dr. Van Doren be allowed to write outpatient prescriptions for Schedules II through V controlled dangerous substances on serially numbered duplicate prescriptions.
3. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke Dr. Van Doren's medical license, after additional notice and hearing as required by law.
4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Van Doren as soon as it is processed.


