## **ORDER OF EMERGENCY SUSPENSION**

On the 9th day of August, 2002, the Plaintiff's application for emergency suspension of Defendant, David Johnson McWilliams, M.D., Oklahoma Medical License No. 18088, came on for hearing before the Secretary of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (the "Board"). Elizabeth A. Scott, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the Plaintiff, the State of Oklahoma ex rel. the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. Defendant appeared in person and through counsel, Bob Carpenter.

The Secretary, after hearing arguments of counsel, reviewing exhibits admitted and being fully advised in the premises, found that there is clear and convincing evidence to support the following findings of fact and conclusions of law and orders:

- 1. Defendant, David Johnson McWilliams, M.D., is licensed as a physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma and holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 18088.
- 2. The Board is a duly authorized agency of the State of Oklahoma empowered to license and oversee the activities of physicians and surgeons in the State of Oklahoma pursuant to 59 O.S. §480 et seq. The Board has jurisdiction over these proceedings, and notice has been given in accordance with law.
- 3. The evidence reflects that Defendant cannot practice medicine with a reasonable degree of safety, competency and skill sufficient to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

- 4. Defendant's medical license is hereby suspended pending a full hearing before the Board *en banc* at the next regularly scheduled meeting, currently scheduled for September 19-21, 2002.
- 5. All of the charges in the Complaint and Citation will also be heard before the Board *en banc* at its next regularly scheduled meeting.
- 6. The emergency suspension shall be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank and all other appropriate groups.
- 7. Defendant will surrender his Oklahoma wallet card and certificate of medical license to the Board on or before 4:30 p.m. on August 16, 2002.
