ORDER GRANTING LICENSURE
UNDER TERMS OF PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on May 9, 1992, at the office of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the staff of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision; and the Applicant appeared in person, pro se, waived his right to counsel and agreed to proceed without counsel.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision reviewed the application and all attached exhibits, heard sworn testimony and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision therefore finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That the Applicant is applying for licensure in Oklahoma as a physician and surgeon.
2. That the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That evidence indicated the Applicant had a previous history of substance abuse, followed by a lengthy period of sobriety, and that in order to protect public health, safety and welfare, license should be probated with terms and conditions as set forth herein.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That when all evidence is considered, the Applicant does fulfill the requirements of 59 O.S. 1991, Sec. 481 et seq., and applicable rules and regulations of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to qualify for licensure in Oklahoma as a physician and surgeon.
2. That the Board does have jurisdiction over this Applicant, and the Applicant must fulfill terms and conditions of a three-year probation beginning on or around July 1, 1992, as set forth below.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. That the application of Huey Thomas Holt, Jr., for licensure in Oklahoma as a physician and surgeon should be and the same is hereby GRANTED.

2. That the Applicant/Defendant accepts and agrees to and does hereby begin a term of probation to the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision to begin on July 1, 1992, and continue for a period of three (3) years, unless earlier modified by the Board, on its own motion or on the motion of the Applicant/Defendant, under the following terms and conditions:

- (a) During the period of probation Applicant will abstain from consuming alcohol or any substance, specifically including but not limited to controlled dangerous substances, which would adversely affect his ability to practice medicine or surgery as interpreted by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.
- (b) During the period of probation Applicant will submit biological fluid specimens to include, but not limited to, blood and urine, for analysis, upon request of any investigator or other agent representing the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, and Applicant will pay for testing and analysis of those specimens.
- (c) During the period of probation Applicant will maintain formal relationship with the Physician Recovery Committee of OSMA and participate in their meetings and activities and provide proof thereof to the Board.
- (d) During the period of probation Applicant will submit to the Investigation Division of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision any required reports and forms on a timely and prompt basis.
- (e) Pursuant to Title 59 O.S. Sec. 506, Applicant shall promptly pay within 30 days of receipt of invoice from the Board the costs of investigation, prosecution and probation of this case, unless the Applicant affirmatively obtains a deferment of all or part of said fees upon presentation of evidence that is acceptable to the Board Secretary.
- (f) That violation of any of the terms and conditions of probation shall be grounds for additional charges to be presented to the Board after notice to the Applicant.

3. That the jurisdiction of the Board in this individual proceeding will continue until the terms and conditions of probation are modified or lifted by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on their own motion or on the motion of the Applicant/Defendant.

4. That failure to meet any of the above terms of probation will constitute cause for the Board to initiate additional proceedings to suspend or revoke Applicant/Defendant's Oklahoma Medical License, after additional due notice and hearing.

5. That the Applicant/Defendant should receive a copy of this written Order as soon as possible.
