VOLUNTARY SUBMITTAL TO JURISDICTION AND ORDER

THIS MATTER comes on before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on the application of Richard Rani Wajsbort for licensure as a medical doctor in the State of Oklahoma. And the Board, having heard the argument and information provided, makes the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and Order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The applicant acknowledged in his application for licensure to previous abuse of drugs, to-wit: cocaine;

2. The applicant subsequently completed a treatment program for such abuse;

3. The Board, as the regulatory body for medical doctors in the State of Oklahoma, maintains a significant interest in ensuring the proper practice of medicine and surgery in this state;

4. In that capacity, the Board may set terms and conditions of licensure consistent with its statutory authority.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act, 59 O.S.1991, §§ 481, et seq., as amended;

2. In an application for licensure before the Board, the burden

is upon the applicant to prove the applicant's ability to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety. <u>Id</u>.

ORDER

In regard to the application of Richard Rani Wajsbort, the Board ORDERS the approval of the application with the following particulars:

1. The applicant license, as approved by the Board, is placed on probation for a period of five (5) years beginning on the $\underline{\underline{\mathbf{5}}}^{\underline{\mathbf{5}}}$ day of $\underline{\underline{Dec}}$, 199 $\underline{\underline{\mathbf{4}}}$;

During the period of probation, the applicant shall not prescribe, dispense or administer any medication, including but not limited to controlled dangerous substances, for his personal use;
During the period of probation, the applicant shall take no medication except as is specifically authorized by a physician treating him and for a legitimate medical need. The applicant shall have the affirmative duty to inform the treating physician of the applicant's previous abuse of cocaine;

4. During the period of probation, the applicant shall not consume or use in any way any substance which would have an adverse affect on his ability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety;

5. During the period of probation, the applicant shall submit biological fluid specimens to include, but not limited to, blood and urine, for analysis upon request of any investigator or other agent of the Board, the costs of which analysis shall be paid by the applicant;

6. During the period of probation, the applicant shall submit to

and cooperate with periodic interviews and/or evaluations conducted by the Staff of the Board;

7. During the period of probation, the applicant shall appear before the Board whenever requested to do so;

8. During the period of probation, the applicant shall submit to the Investigation Division of the Board any required reports or forms on a timely basis;

9. The applicant shall at all times conduct his practice of medicine in compliance with the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act;

10. During the period of probation, the applicant shall not supervise a physician's assistant;

11. During the period of probation, the applicant shall pay all costs of probation;

12. During the period of probation, the applicant shall notify any hospital where he holds privileges, or clinic, or group where he practice of the terms and conditions of this Order and provide a copy thereof;
