ORDER GRANTING TERMINATION OF INDEFINITE PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Medical Board of Licensure and Supervision on March 6, 2014, at the office of the Board, 101 N.E. 51st Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board. Defendant, Todd Scott Redding, M.D., appeared in person.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the Motion and being fully apprised of the premises, entered the following Findings of Fact, conclusions of Law, and Orders:

Findings of Fact

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and rules of the Board.
- 2. Dr. Redding currently holds medical license no. 19387 under an indefinite term of probation that commenced January 17, 2008.
- 3. On March 11, 2010, Dr. Redding requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to prescribe controlled dangerous drugs in Schedules IV through V. The Board granted Dr. Redding's request.
- 4. On September 15, 2011, Dr. Redding requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to prescribe controlled dangerous drugs in Schedules III and II,

with the Schedule II prescriptions limited to prescribing methadone in an opiate treatment program setting.

- 5. Defendant is seeking to terminate the indefinite probation which commenced on January 17, 2008.
- 6. After hearing testimony the Board has determined that it is appropriate to terminate Defendant's indefinite probation.

Conclusions of Law

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to reinstate the license of a physician pursuant to 59 O.S. §508.1
- 2. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 O.S. §480 et seq. The Board may also modify, or remove entirely, previously placed restrictions.

<u>Order</u>

It is therefore **ORDERED** by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

 Defendant's indefinite probation, the terms of which are described in the January 17, 2008 Order, the March 11, 2010 Order Modifying Probation, and the September 23, 2011 Second Order Modifying Probation is hereby TERMINATED.
