ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on March 27, 2003, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Robert Raymond Horanzy, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 20039, appeared in person and pro se.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

2. Dr. Horanzy currently holds medical license no. 20039 under a three (3) year term of probation that commenced on or around March 14, 2002. Under the term of Dr. Horanzy's probation, the Board Secretary was to review Defendant's probation reports and reports from his therapist to determine whether or not early termination or modification of probation was warranted.

3. Dr. Horanzy has requested that his probation be terminated based upon the fact that he had completed the requirements of his probation.

4. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Dr. Horanzy had complied to date with the terms of probation .

5. Dr. Horanzy has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. Dr. Horanzy has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested early termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 et seq. 1

Dr. Horanzy has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of the 2. remainder of his probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Dr. Horanzy's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Dr. Horanzy serve the remainder of his probationary term.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

Dr. Horanzy's application to terminate probation is GRANTED and his 1. probationary period is terminated effective March 27, 2003.
