COMPLAINT

COMES NOW the plaintiff, the State of Oklahoma ex rel. the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (the "Board"), by and through its attorney, Elizabeth A. Scott, Assistant Attorney General, and for its Complaint against the Defendant, Larry Allen Minton, M.D., Oklahoma medical license no. 20590, alleges and states as follows:

1. The Board is a duly authorized agency of the State of Oklahoma empowered to license and oversee the activities of physicians and surgeons in the State of Oklahoma pursuant to 59 Okla. Stat. §480 *et seq.*

2. Defendant, Larry Allen Minton, M.D., holds Oklahoma medical license no. 20590.

3. On or about December 14, 2006, Defendant was disciplined by the Medical Disciplinary Board of the Department of Financial and Professional Regulation of the State of Illinois wherein his medical license was **INDEFINITELY SUSPENDED**. Defendant's suspension was based upon a finding that (a) Defendant made a misrepresentation in applying for renewal of his Illinois medical license, (b) he had failed to pay his Illinois individual income tax for the tax years 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, and 2003, and (c) he had failed to file individual tax returns for the tax years 2001, 2002 and 2003.

4. Defendant is guilty of unprofessional conduct in that he:

- A. Was subject to disciplinary action of another state or jurisdiction based upon acts or conduct by the licensee similar to acts or conduct that would constitute grounds for action as defined in this section pursuant to OAC 435:10-7-4(31).

Conclusion

WHEREFORE, plaintiff requests that the Board conduct a hearing, and upon proof of the allegations contained herein, impose such disciplinary action as authorized by law, up to and including the revocation or suspension of the Defendant's license to practice as a physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma, the assessment of costs and fees incurred in this action, and any other appropriate action with respect to Defendant's license to practice as a physician and surgeon in the State of Oklahoma.
