ORDER DENYING TERMINATION OF PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on May 20, 2004, at the Board's office, 5104 North Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73118, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Wilbur D. Hilst appeared in person and through counsel, Daniel Gamino.

Elizabeth A. Scott, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the exhibits presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

Findings of Fact

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

2. Dr. Hilst currently holds medical license no. 20686 under an indefinite term of probation that commenced on November 27, 2002.

3. On May 20, 2004, Dr. Hilst requested that his probation be terminated so as to allow him to obtain hospital privileges and to become Clinical Director at the Mary Mahoney Clinic in Choctaw, Oklahoma.

4. The proposed termination of Dr. Hilst's probation does not afford sufficient

practice limitations or controls to assure that Dr. Hilst can practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear requests for termination of probation on licenses under 59 Okla. Stat. §480 *et seq.*
- 2. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 Okla. Stat. §480 *et seq.*

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1. Dr. Hilst's request for termination of probation is **DENIED**.
- 2. A copy of this written order shall be sent to Dr. Hilst as soon as it is processed.
