**ORDER DENYING MOTION TO TERMINATE PROBATION**

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on May 3, 2001, at the office of the Board, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Paul C. Redman, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 20796, appeared in person, *pro se*, thereby waiving his right to counsel at the hearing.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact:

***FINDINGS OF FACT***

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

2. The evidence reflects that:

a. Defendant is licensed as a physician and surgeon in Oklahoma under Oklahoma Medical License No. 20796.

b. On November 2, 2000, Defendant entered into a Voluntary Submittal to

Jurisdiction following a complaint and citation for unprofessional conduct. The VSJ included a ninety (90) day suspension and a five (5) year probation immediately following the suspension.

c. On April 26, 2001, Defendant requested that his probation be terminated.

d. Defendant has served approximately five (5) months of the five (5) year probationary period.

e. Defendant has not shown satisfactory evidence of his ability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety without any restrictions to justify early termination of his probation.

3. These factors raise serious issues as to the Defendant's ability to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety, and the Defendant has failed to produce evidence to overcome these issues as to his competency and fitness to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Oklahoma under a full, unrestricted license.

#### *CONCLUSIONS OF LAW*

1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 481 *et seq.*

2. Defendant failed to fulfill the requirements of 59 Okla. Stat. §481 *et seq.*, and the applicable rules of the Board, to justify early termination of the probationary terms imposed upon his Oklahoma Medical License under the November 2, 2000 Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction.

#### *ORDER*


**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Defendant's motion to terminate his probation and to restore to him a full and unrestricted license is **DENIED**.

2. All terms and conditions of the Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction entered on November 2, 2000 in this case shall remain in full force and effect until modified or terminated by Board order upon its own motion or pursuant to motion of Defendant.

3. A copy of this written order shall be sent to Defendant as soon as it is processed.

ORDER MODIFYING PROBATION

Applicant, Paul C. Redman, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 20796, appeared in person without counsel, thereby waiving his right to legal representation.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

***FINDINGS OF FACT***

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
2. Dr. Redman currently holds medical license no. 20796 under a five-year term of probation that commenced November 13, 2000.
3. On April 26, 2001, Dr. Redman requested that his probation be terminated, which request was denied by the Board by Order dated May 3, 2001
4. Alternatively, on April 26, 2001, Dr. Redman requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to write hospital orders for controlled dangerous drugs for hospital in-patients during the time of his residency program.
5. Dr. Redman presented sufficient evidence to support the requested modification.

*CONCLUSIONS OF LAW*


1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*
2. Dr. Redman has presented satisfactory evidence to justify allowing him to write hospital orders for controlled dangerous drugs for hospital in-patients during the time of his residency program.

*ORDER*

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:


1. Dr. Redman's application to modify the terms of his probation is **GRANTED**.
2. Dr. Redman's probation shall continue for five (5) years from the date of its commencement of November 13, 2000 under the terms and conditions set forth in the November 2, 2000 Order, with the exception that Dr. Redman be allowed to write hospital orders for controlled dangerous drugs for hospital in-patients during the time of his residency program.
3. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke Dr. Redman's medical license, after additional notice and hearing as required by law.
4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Redman as soon as it is processed.
