### **ORDER MODIFYING PROBATION**

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on November 20, 2003, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Paul C. Redman, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 20796, appeared in person without counsel, thereby waiving his right to legal representation.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

2. Dr. Redman currently holds medical license no. 20796 under a five-year term of probation that commenced November 13, 2000.

3. On April 26, 2001, Dr. Redman requested that his probation be terminated, which request was denied by the Board by Order dated May 3, 2001

4. Alternatively, on April 26, 2001, Dr. Redman requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to write hospital orders for controlled dangerous drugs for hospital in-patients during the time of his residency program, which request was granted by the Board by Order dated May 3, 2001.

5. On September 11, 2001, Dr. Redman requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to write hospital orders for controlled dangerous drugs for hospital inpatients after the completion of his residency training. Dr. Redman additionally requested that he be allowed to reapply for his state and federal controlled dangerous drug permits, and that he be allowed to write prescriptions for controlled dangerous drugs in Schedules III, IV and V for outpatient purposes on duplicate prescriptions. By order dated September 11, 2001, the Board granted Dr. Redman's requests.

6. On November 20, 2003, Dr. Redman requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to write prescriptions for controlled dangerous drugs in Schedule II for outpatient purposes on duplicate prescriptions.

7. Dr. Redman presented sufficient evidence to support the requested modification.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1 The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 et seq.

2. Dr. Redman has presented satisfactory evidence to justify allowing him to write prescriptions for controlled dangerous drugs in Schedule II for outpatient purposes on duplicate prescriptions.

### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. Redman's application to modify the terms of his probation is **GRANTED**.

2. Dr. Redman's probation shall continue for five (5) years from the date of its commencement of November 13, 2000 under the terms and conditions set forth in the November 2, 2000 Order, as modified by Board orders dated May 3, 2001 and September 11, 2001, with the exception that Dr. Redman be allowed to prescriptions for controlled dangerous drugs in Schedule II for outpatient purposes on duplicate prescriptions.

3. Failure to meet any of the terms of this Order will be grounds for the Board to initiate proceedings to suspend or revoke Dr. Redman's medical license, after additional notice and hearing as required by law.

4. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Redman as soon as it is processed.
