**ORDER MODIFYING  
TERMS OF PROBATION**

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on March 7, 2013, at the Board office, 101 N.E. 51<sup>st</sup> Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Zachariah Jessica Anderson, MD, Defendant, appeared in person, *pro se*, thereby waiving his right to legal counsel.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the exhibits presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, entered the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Orders:

**Findings of Fact**

1. Defendant currently holds Oklahoma medical license no. 22198.
2. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

3. On January 12, 2012, after due notice and hearing, the Board entered an Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction whereby Defendant's medical license was **SUSPENDED** for a period of one (1) month from September 1, 2011 to October 1, 2011 and Defendant was placed on **INDEFINITE PROBATION**.

4. The Defendant requests that the term of his probation as currently stated in Paragraph G of the Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction be modified to allow him to work more than forty (40) hours per week.

5. The Defendant presented sufficient evidence to support his Motion to Modify Probation.

### **Conclusions of Law**

1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O.S. §480 et seq.
2. Defendant has presented satisfactory evidence to justify the modification to his probation allowing him to work more than forty (40) hours per week.


### **Order**

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Defendant's probation shall continue indefinitely as set forth in the Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction filed herein on January 12, 2012.
2. Defendant's probation shall be modified as currently stated in Paragraph G of the Order Accepting Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction filed herein on January 12, 2012 as follows:  


"G. Defendant shall limit his work week to no more than seventy-five (75) hours per week with no off-site work."
3. Defendant shall appear before the Board in six (6) months from the date of this Order to report his progress.
4. During the period of probation, failure to meet any of the terms of probation will constitute cause for the Board to initiate additional proceedings to suspend or revoke Defendant's license, after due notice and hearing.
5. A copy of this written order shall be sent to Defendant as soon as it is processed.
6. This Order shall be effective March 7, 2013.
