ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on May 20, 2010, at the Oklahoma State Medical Association, 313 N.E. 50th Street, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Mark Edward Reiheld, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 23029, appeared in person and pro se.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
2. Dr. Reiheld currently holds medical license no. 23029 under an indefinite term of probation that commenced on January 17, 2008.
3. On March 26, 2009, Board staff, on behalf of Dr. Reiheld, requested that the terms of his probation be modified to delete the requirement that he practice under the direct supervision of a physician licensed by the Board and that he submit quarterly reports from his supervising physician to the Board Secretary for his review. The Board granted the requested modification.
4. On May 20, 2010, Dr. Reiheld requested that his probation be terminated.
5. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Dr. Reiheld had complied to date with the terms of probation.

6. Dr. Reiheld has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. Dr. Reiheld has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*
2. Dr. Reiheld has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of his probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Dr. Reiheld's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Dr. Reiheld remain on probation.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. Reiheld's application to terminate probation is **GRANTED** and his probationary period is terminated immediately.
2. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. Reiheld as soon as it is processed.


