VERIFIED COMPLAINT

The State of Oklahoma, *ex rel.*, the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (“Board”), alleges and states as follows for its Complaint against Jeffrey Denton Floyd, M.D. (“Defendant”):

I. JURISDICTION

1. The Board is a duly authorized agency of the State of Oklahoma empowered to license and oversee the activities of physicians and surgeons in the State of Oklahoma pursuant to 59 Okla. Stat. § 480, *et seq.*
2. Defendant, Jeffrey Denton Floyd, M.D., holds Oklahoma medical license number 23229. The acts and omissions complained of herein were made while Defendant was acting as a physician pursuant to the medical license conferred upon him by the State of Oklahoma, and such acts and omissions occurred within the physical territory of the State of Oklahoma.

II. ALLEGATIONS OF UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

3. On or about December 2, 2020, Defendant Self-Reported by the doctor action taken by Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs (“OBND”) for one pre-signed blank prescription discovered by a pharmacist on March 13, 2019. In July of 2019, OBND fined the doctor \$2000.00.
4. In the OBND case, the parties entered a Stipulation and Agreed Order. In that Order, the parties stipulated to the following Findings of Fact:

“7. That Dr. Jeffrey Floyd (hereinafter - *Respondent*) is licensed by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (license number 23229); “

“8. That Respondent is an OBN registrant (OBN registration number 30613), authorized to dispense, prescribe, administer or use for scientific purposes controlled dangerous substances in Schedules II through V of the UCDSA; “

“9. That based on an OBN investigation, on March 13, 2019, Respondent failed to maintain effective controls against the diversion of controlled dangerous substances when he inadvertently provided one (1) pre-signed blank prescription to a patient; and, “

“10. That although there was a failure to maintain effective controls, no controlled dangerous substances were diverted due to the pre-signed prescription and OBN has determined this is not a systemic issue in Dr. Floyd's practice.”

5. The parties further stipulated that Defendant violated provisions of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act of the State of Oklahoma, 63 O.S. §2-101 et seq.

III. VIOLATIONS

6. Based on the foregoing, the Defendant is guilty of unprofessional conduct as follows:
- a. Violating the criminal laws of this state when such act is connected with the physician's practice of medicine, in violation of 59 O.S. § 509(9):
 - b. Violating any state or federal law or regulation relating to controlled substances, in violation of OAC 435:10-7-4(27)):

CONCLUSION

Given the foregoing, the undersigned requests the Board conduct a hearing and, upon proof of the allegations contained herein, impose such disciplinary action as authorized by law, up to and including suspension or revocation and any other appropriate action with respect to the Defendant's professional license, including an assessment of costs and attorney's fees incurred in this action as provided by law.
