COMES NOW the plaintiff, the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, and for its Dismissal Without Prejudice, submits the following:


1. On or about October 12, 2005, the State filed a Complaint and Citation against Defendant based upon alleged substance abuse and Defendant's failure to disclose her substance abuse on her licensure renewal form. At the time of the filing of the Complaint, Defendant had already completed treatment for substance abuse twice.

2. Subsequent to the filing of the Complaint and Citation, Defendant was ordered to active duty in the United States Army Reserve beginning January 5, 2006 and continuing for a period of 566 days.

3. Since Defendant's return from active duty, there have been no further complaints of substance abuse involving Defendant.

WHEREFOR, the State of Oklahoma hereby dismisses its complaint against Defendant, Julie Anne Johnson, P.T., License No. PT2349, without prejudice to the refiling of the same.


