ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on January 14, 2010, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Dawn Marie LaFromboise, M.D., holding Oklahoma medical license no. 23500, appeared in person and pro se.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
2. Dr. LaFromboise currently holds medical license no. 23500 under a five (5) year term of probation that commenced on March 9, 2006.
3. On January 14, 2010, Dr. LaFromboise requested that her probation be terminated to allow her to seek entry into a residency program with an unrestricted license
4. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Dr. LaFromboise had complied to date with the terms of probation.
5. Dr. LaFromboise has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. Dr. LaFromboise has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*
2. Dr. LaFromboise has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of her probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Dr. LaFromboise's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Dr. LaFromboise remain on probation.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Dr. LaFromboise's application to terminate probation is **GRANTED** and her probationary period is terminated effective upon payment of all outstanding probation costs and fees.
2. A copy of this written order should be sent to Dr. LaFromboise as soon as it is processed.


