VOLUNTARY SUBMITTAL TO JURISDICTION

COMES NOW the Applicant, Wendall E. Miles, the undersigned and states that on this 7. day of 5. 1996, he is of sound mind and not under the influence of any medication or drug or impaired thereby and that the Applicant fully recognizes his right to appear before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, en banc, for evidentiary hearing on previous substance abuse revocation of physician assistant and certification, does of his own volition and decision waive and forego his right to appear before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision for full hearing inasmuch as Applicant believes a controversy exists as to whether the Board should issue certification with some sanction under the Physician Assistant Act, and further the Applicant does hereby and of his own volition submit to the jurisdiction of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision insofar as it entails the following activities and restrictions:

- 1. That Applicant accepts and agrees to and does hereby begin a term of probation to the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision for a period of five (5) years under the following terms and conditions:
 - (a) Applicant will conduct his practice in compliance with the Physician Assistant Act as interpreted by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. Any question of interpretation regarding said Act shall be submitted in writing to the Board and no action based on the subject of the questions will be taken by Applicant until clarification of interpretations is received by Applicant from the Board.
 - (b) During the period of probation, Applicant will furnish to each and every state in which he holds certification/licensure or applies for certification/licensure and hospitals, clinics or other institutions in which he holds or anticipates holding any form of staff privilege, a copy of the Board Order

stipulating sanctions imposed by the Board.

- (c) During the period of probation, Applicant will abstain from consuming alcohol or any other substance, specifically including but not limited to, controlled dangerous substances which would adversely affect his performance as a physician assistant as interpreted by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.
- (d) During the period of probation, Applicant will submit biological fluid specimens to include, but not limited to blood and urine, for analysis, upon request of the Board or its designee, and Applicant will pay for the analysis thereof.
- (e) During the period of probation, Applicant will not prescribe, administer or dispense any medications for personal use.
- (f) During the period of probation, Applicant will take no medication except that which is authorized by a physician treating him for a legitimate medical need. Applicant has the affirmative duty to inform any and every doctor treating him of the Board Order immediately upon initiation of treatment.
- (g) During the period of probation, Applicant will continue psychiatric or psychological treatment under a doctor approved by the Board Secretary. Applicant will authorize in writing the release of any and all records of that treatment to this Board.
- (h) During the period of probation, Applicant will remain involved in a recovery program approved by the Board Secretary.
- (i) During the period of probation, Applicant will keep the Board informed of his current address.
- (j) During the period of probation, Applicant will keep current payment of all assessment by the Board for prosecution, investigation and monitoring of his case.
- (k) Until such time as all indebtedness to the Board has been satisfied, Applicant will reaffirm said indebtedness in any and all bankruptcy proceedings.
- 2. That the jurisdiction of the Board in this individual proceeding will continue until the terms and conditions of probation are modified or lifted by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on their own motion or on the motion of the Applicant.
 - 3. The Applicant further agrees that failure to meet any of

the above terms of probation will constitute cause for the Board to initiate additional proceedings to suspend or revoke Applicant's Oklahoma Physician Assistant Certification, after additional due notice and hearing.
