ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on January 14, 2010, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Terry Jackson Hewitt, PTA, holding Oklahoma physical therapy assistant license no. TA424, appeared in person and pro se.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
- 2. Mr. Hewitt currently holds physical therapy assistant license no. TA424 under a five (5) year term of probation that commenced on February 11, 2006.
- 3. On May 17, 2007, Mr. Hewitt requested that the terms of his probation be modified to allow him to discontinue both marital counseling and individual counseling as required by paragraphs 3(H) and (I) of his Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction. The Board granted Mr. Hewitt's request.
- 4. On January 14, 2010, Mr. Hewitt and the State requested that the terms of his probation be terminated.
- 5. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that Mr. Hewitt had complied to date with the terms of probation. Merlin Kilbury, M.D., testified

that Mr. Hewitt had complied to date with the terms of his contract with the Oklahoma Health Professionals Recovery Program.

6. Mr. Hewitt has complied to date in all respects with the terms of probation, and the purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. Mr. Hewitt has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. §§ 480 and 887.1 et seq.
- 2. Mr. Hewitt has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of his probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished by Mr. Hewitt's compliance with the probationary terms. No useful purpose would be gained by having Mr. Hewitt remain on probation.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- 1. The State and Mr. Hewitt's application to terminate probation is **GRANTED** and his probationary period is terminated effective upon payment of all outstanding probation costs and fees.
- 2. A copy of this written order should be sent to Mr. Hewitt as soon as it is processed.
