COMPLAINT

COMES NOW J. G. Landreth, Investigator for the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, being first duly sworn upon oath and states:

1. That Winfred L. Medcalf, M.D., holding Oklahoma Medical License Number 7115, is in violation of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59 O.S. 1981, Section 509, Paragraph 17, to-wit:

"17. Prescribing, dispensing or administering of Controlled Substances or Narcotic drugs in excess of the amount considered good medical practice, or prescribing, dispensing or administering controlled substances or narcotic drugs without medical need in accordance with published standards."

2. That Winfred L. Medcalf, M.D., is in violation of the rules and regulations promulgated by this Board, specifically Section X, Rules 1A, 1B, and 1F, to-wit:

"Rule 1A. Indiscriminate or excessive prescribing, dispensing, or administering of controlled or narcotic drugs."

"Rule 1B. Prescribing, dispensing or administering of controlled or narcotic drugs in excess of the amount considered good medical practice."

"Rule 1F. Dispensing, prescribing or administering a controlled substance or narcotic drug without medical need."

3. That from April 1, 1990 through August 31, 1990 Defendant wrote approximately 348 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotic drugs totalling 22,816 dosage units.

4. That a prescription survey conducted in reference to certain scheduled drugs reveals that patient H.R. received approximately 25 prescriptions from the time of April 19, 1990 through August 28, 1990 for 2,140 dosage units of Controlled or Narcotic drugs or an average of 16.21 dosage units per day.

5. That the survey reveals that patient F.H. received 23 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotic drugs from April 17, 1990 through August 27, 1990 for a total of 1,688 dosage units or an average of 12.69 dosage units per day.

6. That the survey reveals that patient C.B. received 12 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotic drugs from April 18, 1990 through July 13, 1990 for a total of 770 dosage units or an average of 8.85 dosage units per day.

7. That the survey reveals that patient H.G. received 10 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotics drugs from April 23, 1990 through August 13, 1990 for a total of 930 dosage units or an average of 8.23 dosage units per day.

8. That the survey reveals that patient Mrs. W.R.B. received 7 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotic drugs from the period May 1, 1990 through August 16, 1990 for a total of 860 dosage units or an average of 7.96 dosage units per day.

9. That the survey reveals that patient L.T. received 13 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotic drugs from the period of April 3, 1990 through August 17, 1990 for a total of 900 dosage units or an average of 6.75 dosage units per day.

10. That the survey reveals that patient C.M. received 10 prescriptions for Controlled or Narcotic drugs from the period of April 8, 1990 through August 7, 1990 for a total of 750 dosage units or an average of 6.15 dosage units per day.

11. That the patient records reveal that Scheduled drugs were being prescribed in excess of the amount considered for the medical need presented.

WHEREFORE, Complainant prays this Board to conduct a hearing and upon proof of the allegations contained herein that such

disciplinary action be taken by the Board as is authorized by
law
