ORDER ACCEPTING VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF LICENSE IN LIEU OF PROSECUTION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (the "Board") en banc on the <u>J</u> day of November 2000 at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, OK 73118, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Elizabeth A. Scott, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the State of Oklahoma, ex rel. the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. The Defendant acknowledges the proceedings and waives personal appearance.

The Board *en banc* heard testimony, reviewed the exhibits presented, and being fully apprised in the premises, finds that there is clear and convincing evidence of the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Orders:

<u>Findings of Fact</u>

- 1. Barbara Payton-Lewis currently possesses Oklahoma occupational therapy license no. OT721.
- 2. Defendant Barbara Payton-Lewis, O.T., is the subject of a complaint and citation filed by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.
- 3. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.

- 4. Pursuant to 59 O.S. §509(E), Defendant wishes to surrender her Oklahoma Occupational Therapy License No. OT721 in lieu of prosecution.
- 5. The surrender of Occupational Therapy License No. OT721 is freely and voluntarily made, and the Defendant has not been subject to duress or coercion.
 - 6. The Defendant is fully aware of the consequences of the surrender of her license.
- 7. Defendant has plead guilty to the allegations constituting misconduct and acknowledges that the allegations, if proven, could constitute grounds for disciplinary action by the Board.
- 8. Defendant has submitted a sworn statement describing the misconduct to which she has plead guilty as required by 59 O.S. §509(E).
- 9. Defendant has surrendered her wall certificate and wallet card with her request for voluntary surrender of her license.

Conclusions of Law

- 10. The Board has jurisdiction over the defendant and the subject matter herein pursuant to 59 O.S. §888.1et seq.
- 11. Pursuant to 59 O.S. §509(E), the Board has the authority to accept this surrender of license in lieu of prosecution.
- 12. The request of defendant to surrender her license is appropriate under the circumstances of this case.
- 13. Clear and convincing evidence exists for the conditions of surrender of Occupational Therapy License No. OT721.

Order

- 14. The voluntary surrender of license in lieu of prosecution submitted by defendant is hereby accepted by the Board.
- 15. Oklahoma Occupational Therapy License No. OT721 of the defendant, Barbara Payton-Lewis, O.T., should be and is hereby surrendered as of the date of this order, November 4, 2000.
- 16. Pursuant to 59 O.S. §509.1(E)(4), the defendant shall pay all reasonable costs expended by the Board for any legal fees and costs, and any investigation, probation and

monitoring fees, including but not limited to staff time, salary and travel expenses, witness fees and attorney's fees incurred with respect to this case.
