

4. Defendant is now seeking reinstatement of his Oklahoma physician assistant license no. PA732.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Board has jurisdiction to reinstate the license of a physician assistant pursuant to 59 O.S. §508.1.

2. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 O.S. §480 *et seq.*

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows

1. Defendant's physician assistant license shall be reinstated under the following terms and conditions of **INDEFINITE PROBATION**, which shall continue from the date of reinstatement under the following terms and conditions:

A. Defendant will conduct his practice in compliance with the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act and the Physician Assistant Act as interpreted by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. Any question of interpretation regarding said Acts shall be submitted in writing to the Board and no action based on the subject of the question will be taken by Defendant until clarification of interpretation is received by Defendant from the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.

B. Upon request of the Board Secretary, Defendant will request all hospitals, clinics and other facilities in which he practices to furnish to the Board Secretary a written statement regarding monitoring of his practice while performing services in or to that hospital, clinic or facility.

C. Defendant will furnish to each and every state in which he holds licensure or applies for licensure and hospitals, clinics or other institutions in which he holds or anticipates holding any form of staff privilege or employment, a copy of the Board Order

stipulating sanctions imposed by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.

D. Defendant will practice under the direct supervision of his supervising physician for the first six (6) months after reinstatement of his license. "Direct Supervision" shall be defined as requiring the physical presence of the supervising physician in the office or operating suite before, during and after the treatment or procedure and includes diagnosis, authorization, and evaluation of the treatment or procedure with the physician/patient relationship remaining intact.

E. Defendant shall submit quarterly reports from his supervising physician to the Board Secretary for his review.

F. Defendant will not prescribe, administer, dispense or possess any drugs in Schedules I through V.

G. Defendant will submit for analysis biological fluid specimens including, but not limited to, blood and urine, upon request of the Board or its designee, and Defendant will pay for the costs attendant thereto.

H. Defendant will not prescribe, administer or dispense any medications for personal use or for that of any family member.

I. Defendant will take no medication except that which is authorized by a physician treating him for a legitimate medical need. Defendant has the affirmative duty to inform any and every doctor treating him of the Board Order immediately upon initiation, or continuation of treatment.

J. Defendant will have the affirmative duty not to ingest any substance which will cause a body fluid sample to test positive for prohibited substances, including but not limited to alcohol.

K. Defendant will execute such releases of medical and psychiatric records during the entire term of probation as necessary for use by the Compliance Consultant or other Board designee to obtain copies of medical records and authorize the Compliance Consultant or other Board designee to discuss Defendant's case with Defendant's treating physicians and/or any physicians holding Defendant's records.

L. Defendant will affiliate with and execute a contract with

the Physicians' Recovery Program.

M. Defendant shall promptly notify the Board of any relapse, including any entry, or re-entry, into a treatment program for substance abuse.

N. Defendant shall promptly notify the Board of any citation or arrest for traffic or for criminal offenses involving substance abuse.

O. Defendant will keep the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision informed of his current address.

P. Defendant will keep current payment of all assessment by the Board for prosecution, investigation and monitoring of his case, including but not limited to a \$100.00 per month monitoring fee.

Q. Until such time as all indebtedness to the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has been satisfied, Defendant will reaffirm said indebtedness in any and all bankruptcy proceedings.

R. Defendant shall make himself available for one or more personal appearances before the Board or its designee upon request.

S. Defendant shall submit any required reports and forms on a timely and prompt basis to the Compliance Coordinator or designee.

2. During the period of probation, failure to meet any of the terms of probation will constitute cause for the Board to initiate additional proceedings to suspend or revoke Defendant's license, after due notice and hearing.

3. Defendant's license will be reinstated only upon payment in full of all costs and expenses incurred by the State of Oklahoma.

4. Defendant may apply for modification or termination of his probation after a minimum of one (1) year has passed after his license has been reinstated.

5. A copy of this written order shall be sent to Defendant as soon as it is processed.


