ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

This matter came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on March 9, 2006, at the Board office, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and rules of the Board.

Applicant, Mark Brian Jones, P.A., holding Oklahoma physician assistant license no. PA732, appeared not.

The Board sitting *en banc* after hearing testimony, reviewing the request and other materials presented, and being fully apprised of the premises, made the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board *en banc* has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein, and notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
2. Mr. Jones currently holds physician assistant license no. PA732 under an indefinite term of probation that commenced on or around October 2, 1995, was tolled on or about September 1, 1999, then was reinstated on or about November 5, 2004.
3. Mr. Jones has requested that his probation be terminated effective March 9, 2006 due to his history of compliance with the terms of his probation.
4. Tom Sosbee, Compliance and Education Coordinator for the Board, testified that the Board staff has no objection to the requested early termination.
5. Mr. Jones has presented sufficient evidence to support the requested early termination.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter pursuant to 59 O. S. § 480 *et seq.*
2. Mr. Jones has presented satisfactory evidence to justify termination of the remainder of his probationary period. The purposes of the probationary period have been accomplished. No useful purpose would be gained by having Mr. Jones serve the remainder of his probationary term.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. Mr. Jones' application to terminate probation is **GRANTED** and his probationary period is terminated effective March 9, 2006.
2. A copy of this written order should be sent to Mr. Jones as soon as it is processed.
