FINAL ORDER

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on February 29, 1992, at the office of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Edward A. Shadid, M.D., Defendant, appeared in person, pro se, waived his right to counsel and agreed to proceed without counsel.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc took sworn testimony, reviewed exhibits and being fully advised in the premises, the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Defendant, Edward A. Shadid, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 7578.
2. That the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That on or around February 5, 1992, Defendant did execute a Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction relating to alcohol abuse and did voluntarily enter Talbott/Marsh Recovery Center, Atlanta, Georgia, for treatment for substance abuse.
4. That the Voluntary Submittal to Jurisdiction is accepted as agreed disposition of this matter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That Edward A. Shadid, M.D., holding Oklahoma Medical License No. 7578, is in violation of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59 O.S. 1981, Sec. 509, Paragraph 16, to-wit:

"16. The inability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of age, illness, drunkenness, excessive use of drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or any other type of material or as a result of any mental or physical condition."

2. That Edward A. Shadid, M.D., is in violation of the Rules and Regulations promulgated by this Board, specifically Section X, Rule 1C, to-wit:

"Rule 1C: The habitual or excessive use of any drug which impairs the ability to practice medicine with reasonable skill and safety to the patient."

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. That the Defendant, Edward A. Shadid, M.D., holding Oklahoma Medical License No. 7578, should be and is hereby placed on a term of probation to the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision for a period of five (5) years beginning February 29, 1992, under the following terms and conditions:

- (a) During the period of probation Defendant will not prescribe, administer or dispense any medications for his personal use, to specifically include controlled dangerous substances.
- (b) During the period of probation Defendant will take no medication except that which is authorized by a physician treating him for a legitimate medical need and Defendant shall have an affirmative duty to inform any physician treating him of Defendant's previous substance abuse.
- (c) During the period of probation Defendant will abstain from consuming alcohol or any substance, specifically including but not limited to controlled dangerous substances, which would adversely affect his ability to practice medicine or surgery as interpreted by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.
- (d) During the period of probation Defendant will submit biological fluid specimens to include, but not limited to, blood and urine, for analysis, upon request of any investigator or other agent representing the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, and Defendant will pay for testing and analysis of those specimens.
- (e) During the period of probation Defendant will furnish to the office of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision all current legal addresses and any change of address in writing.
- (f) That Defendant shall appear before the Board or a designated member thereof whenever requested to do so.
- (g) During the period of probation Defendant will submit to the Investigation Division of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision any required reports and forms on a timely and prompt basis.
- (h) Pursuant to Title 59 O.S. Sec. 506, Defendant shall promptly pay within 30 days of receipt of invoice from the Board the costs of


investigation, prosecution and probation of this case, unless the Defendant affirmatively obtains a deferment of all or part of said fees upon presentation of evidence that is acceptable to the Board Secretary.

- (i) During the period of probation Defendant shall notify any hospital where he holds staff privileges, or clinic, or group where he practices, of the terms and conditions of this Board Order and supply a copy thereof.
- (j) During the period of probation the Defendant shall not supervise a Physician Assistant within the State of Oklahoma.
- (k) That violation of any of the terms and conditions of probation shall be grounds for additional charges to be presented to the Board after notice to the Defendant.


2. That the jurisdiction of the Board in this individual proceeding will continue until the terms and conditions of probation are modified or lifted by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on their own motion or on the motion of the Defendant.

3. That failure to meet any of the above terms of probation will constitute cause for the Board to initiate additional proceedings to suspend or revoke Defendant's Oklahoma Medical License, after additional due notice and hearing.
