SECOND ORDER DENYING
TERMINATION OF PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Examiners en banc on April 30, 1987, at 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Charles Caleb Elliott, M.D., appeared pro se for the Defendant and announced he was ready to proceed without the assistance of counsel.

The Board of Medical Examiners en banc heard the testimony and reviewed exhibits and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Examiners therefore finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Charles Caleb Elliott, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 7914.
2. That the Board of Medical Examiners en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That following hearing held on May 24, 1985, before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Examiners en banc, the Board reinstated the Defendant's medical license subject to probation for a period of five (5) years under certain terms and conditions as set forth in the Board's Order dated May 30, 1985.
4. The Defendant testified that he was practicing radiology full-time in Elk City, Oklahoma, on a referral basis and also that he was a consultant in Mangum, Oklahoma. Defendant testified he was no longer under active psychiatric care in that he was dismissed by the psychiatrist approximately 18 months ago and that he was still taking lithium and that he had lithium levels determined approximately every six months. Defendant testified further he was in the process of applying for Texas license as a physician and surgeon and that he was also testifying in the defense of a physician in a malpractice case.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Board retains continuing jurisdiction over this Defendant, Charles Caleb Elliott, M.D., Medical License No. 7914, by virtue of its Order issued following the hearing of May 24, 1985, and pursuant to the legal authority of 59 O.S. 1981, §481 et seq.

ORDER


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Examiners of Oklahoma as follows:

1. That the Defendant's request for termination of probation should be and the same is hereby denied.

2. That the Defendant should be complimented and commended for his efforts to date to comply with the terms and conditions of probation established by the Board following hearing on May 24, 1985.


3. That all the terms and conditions of probation established by the Board following hearing on May 24, 1985, are hereby republished, reiterated and specifically retained in force and effect.
