# ORDER GRANTING TERMINATION OF PROBATION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc on the 14th day of May, 1988, at the office of the Oklahoma State Medical Association, 601 NW Expressway, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff, and Charles Caleb Elliott, M.D., Defendant, appeared by written request, pro se, and announced he was ready to proceed without assistance of counsel.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc heard the testimony and reviewed exhibits and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision therefore finds as follows:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. That Defendant, Charles Caleb Elliott, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 7914.
- 2. That the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
- 3. That following hearing held on May 24, 1985, before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Examiners en banc, the Board reinstated the Defendant's medical license subject to probation for a period of five (5) years under certain terms and conditions as set forth in the Board's Order dated May 30, 1985.
- 4. That Defendant was practicing radiology full-time in Elk City, Oklahoma, on a referral basis and also he was a consultant in Mangum, Oklahoma. Defendant also testified he was no longer under active psychiatric care and that he was still taking lithium and that he had lithium levels determined approximately every six months. Defendant testified that he did not feel that further probation would assist him in any way.
- 5. Members of the Investigation Division of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision agreed that further probation would probably not assist or help Dr. Elliott.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Board retains continuing jurisdiction over this Defendant, Charles Caleb Elliott, M.D., Medical License No. 7914, and the exact length of probation and terms thereof are

subject to the judgment and discretion of the Board based upon evidence placed in the record.

#### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

- That the Defendant's subsequent request for termination of probation should be and the same is hereby granted and the prior order placing Defendant under probation is vacated and held for naught.
- That the Defendant should be complimented and commended for his compliance with terms and conditions of probation to date.
- That the Defendant should be advised of this termination of probation and a copy placed in his file.
