

4. Defendant has served 6 months of her probation.
5. Defendant is now requesting that her probation be terminated prior to the expiration of the one year term.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


1. The Board has jurisdiction to reinstate the license of a physical therapy assistant pursuant to 59 O.S. §887.5.
2. The Board may impose practice parameters and other restrictions as necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public under 59 O.S. §887 *et seq.*

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. The order of probation is terminated and Defendant's physical therapy assistant license shall be re-instated under an Agreement for Licensure for a six (6) month period of time. The terms of the Agreement shall require Defendant to enter into a mentoring agreement with a Physical Therapist with monthly meetings for the mentoring physical therapist to review Defendant's documentation and billing records. Defendant shall not practice in the area of home health during the term of this Agreement. Defendant shall reappear before the Physical Therapy Committee at the April, 2013 meeting.
2. This Order Terminating Probation will go into effect and Defendant's license will be reinstated only upon execution of the Agreement for Licensure and upon establishing a payment plan to satisfy in full any money owed to the Board.
3. A copy of this written order shall be sent to Defendant as soon as it is processed.


