ORDER DENYING MOTION TO
REINSTATE MEDICAL LICENSE

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision on February 28, 1992, at the office of the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Daniel J. Gamino, Attorney, appeared for the Plaintiff; and Corazon Banez-Guzman, Defendant, appeared in person and by counsel, Marissa G. James, of Pulley, Cole, Roberts, Cunningham & Stripling, 800 Preston Commons, West, 8117 Preston Rd., Dallas, TX 75225.

The Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc heard sworn testimony, reviewed exhibits, and being fully advised in the premises, the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That Defendant, Corazon Banez-Guzman, M.D., formerly held Oklahoma Medical License No. 8904.
2. That the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision en banc has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and that notice has been given in all respects as required by law and the rules of the Board.
3. That following notice and hearing on February 2, 1991, the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision placed Defendant's medical license on suspension for a period of three (3) years beginning at 8:00 a.m. on February 18, 1991.
4. That the aforesaid Order has remained in full force and effect since that date.
5. That the Defendant presented testimony concerning her present circumstances and in support of her Motion to Reinstate Medical License.
6. That the Board did not find grounds sufficient to support granting of the Defendant's Motion to Reinstate Medical License and said motion should be denied.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That the Defendant failed to fulfill the requirements of 59 O.S. Supp. 1990, Sec. 493 et seq., and applicable rules and regulations of the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, to qualify for licensure in Oklahoma as a physician and surgeon.


ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:


