ORDER

NOW ON this 9th day of September, 1994, there comes on before Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (the "Board") the above styled and numbered administrative action. Plaintiff appears by and through counsel of record, Susan B. Loving, Attorney General of Oklahoma, and James Robert Johnson, Assistant Attorney General. The defendant appeared not. And the Board, having heard the evidence and otherwise being fully apprised of the facts and circumstances in the administrative action, finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The defendant, Charles L. Novosad, M.D., holds Oklahoma Medical License No. 8996.

2. On the 20th of May, 1994, the Board of Medical Examiners of the State of New Mexico (the "New Mexico Board") entered a Decision

Order to revoke the license of the defendant to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Mexico.

3. The basis of the Decision and Order of the New Mexico Board

related to the over-prescription and improper prescription of controlled dangerous substances to patients of the defendant 4. The Order of the New Mexico Board has not been stayed or overturned as of this date

5. The facts found to exist by the New Mexico Board would constitute violations of the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act, 59 0.S.1991, §§ 480, et seq., as amended

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision has jurisdiction in this matter by virtue of the provisions of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, 59 O.S.1991, §§ 481 et seq., as amended;

2. By virtue of the provisions of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act, the Board has the power and jurisdiction to enforce the provisions of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act as the Board deems necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare;

3. The Board has authority to take administrative action against the defendant based upon action by another licensure jurisdiction pursuant to OAC 435:10-7-4(31)

ORDER

It is therefore ORDERED that the medical license of the defendant, Charles L. Novosad, M.D., is hereby REVOKED.
