FINAL ORDER OF SUSPENSION

This cause came on for hearing before the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision (the "Board") on January 27, 2005, at the office of the Board, 5104 N. Francis, Suite C, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, pursuant to notice given as required by law and the rules of the Board.

Elizabeth A. Scott, Assistant Attorney General, appeared for the plaintiff and defendant appeared not.

The Board *en banc* after hearing arguments of counsel, reviewing the pleadings filed, and being fully advised in the premises, found that there is clear and convincing evidence to support the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Orders:

Findings of Fact

1. The Board is a duly authorized agency of the State of Oklahoma empowered to license and oversee the activities of physicians and surgeons in the State of Oklahoma pursuant to 59 Okla. Stat. §480 *et seq.*

2. The Board has jurisdiction over this matter, and notice has been given in all respects in accordance with law and the rules of the Board.

3 Defendant, Stanley Joseph Dombek, M.D., holds Oklahoma license no. 9647.

4. On August 18, 2004, a Complaint was filed against Defendant

alleging numerous violations of the Oklahoma Medical Practice Act. On or about that date, Defendant, through his counsel of record, represented that he would not practice medicine until his Complaint was heard by the Board.

5. Defendant subsequently wrote numerous prescriptions for controlled dangerous substances in direct violation of his agreement not to practice until his Complaint was heard by the Board.

6. On or about January 24, 2005, Defendant entered Rush Behavioral Health Center for treatment for substance abuse.

Conclusions of Law

1. The Board has jurisdiction and authority over the Defendant and subject matter herein pursuant to the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision Act (the "Act") and its applicable regulations. The Board is authorized to enforce the Act as necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

Order


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Oklahoma State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision as follows:

1. The license of Defendant, Stanley Joseph Dombek, M.D., Oklahoma license no. 9647, is hereby **SUSPENDED INDEFINITELY** beginning January 27, 2005 and continuing until he completes treatment and all recommendations of Rush Behavioral Institute and provides a report from Rush to the Board, at which time Defendant may appear before the Board to seek reinstatement of his license.

2. Promptly upon receipt of an invoice, Defendant shall pay all costs of this action authorized by law, including without limitation, legal fees and investigation costs.


3. Defendant's suspended license shall not be reinstated unless Defendant has reimbursed the Board for all taxed costs.
